Making a Case for the Plant Sale Auction

I am looking forward to the Plant Sale & Open House and hope you are too! I was surprised to learn that there is some ambivalence about creating container gardens. (I also recently learned that not everyone loves flannel sheets.) If you are dreading making one, skip it and contribute in some other way. Bring a guest or two or bake up extra refreshments. Personally, I love the challenge, and plan for it all year. If you do too there's now a spot on the bid sheet to sign your work!

Throughout the year I keep an eye out for an interesting container.

This year my main contribution will be a big terrarium in a clear plastic suitcase. (There may be a reason most terrariums are small. I may learn a humbling lesson.) The suitcase came with an assortment



of tequila in it this summer. The tequila is long gone but the suitcase remains, taunting me, challenging me. I immediately thought about using it for a

terrarium but was daunted by its size and modernity; terrariums have a whiff of the Victorian about them. Or did. They are hot right now and I want to get in on the trend. Inspired by the work of Brazilian landscape designer Roberto Burle Marx, whose work I saw celebrated at the New York Botanical Garden this summer, I plan to create a



miniature modern color-scape with moss, ferns and bromeliads; a sense of his sweeping swaths of color and interplay of textures in 114 square inches.



This week I'll make at least one trip to at least one nursery and buy enough plants for half a dozen containers, even though I'm only making one. Then it's on to the actual planting. Timing

is critical. Far enough ahead so the plants in the finished creation look cohesive but not so far that blooms are fading or tender plants dying. And then at the Plant Sale I'll set it free and begin planning for next year. I look forward to seeing your creations.

The Hortense Miller Gardens are the perfect environment to practice Mindfulness Meditation, as the quiet beauty lends itself naturally to feeling calm and peaceful!

Mindfulness Meditation can deepen our experience and appreciation of our environment, manage the chatter of inner dialogue that can cause distractions and stress, and develop a deeper connection with the natural sense of peace that exists both outside of us in our surroundings and within ourselves. We begin with a short talk on the "what and how" of Mindfulness Meditation developing awareness of our breath and the senses. Meditating with the senses includes, smell, taste, sight, sound and body sensations. We begin seated together in a circle with a guided mindfulness meditation practice on how to use all our senses to be more open, aware and present in the moment.

There will be instruction for the walking and sitting meditation intervals and then we will head out into the gardens, allowing people to find an area where they will be doing two rounds of individual silent walking and sitting practice on their own marked by a bell. A journal will be provided for contemplation and reflection.

We will meet together again in the circle for another group guided meditation and spend time sharing observations and conversation.




Trips & Tours




