President's Message

Drinking in the Benefits of Water

Tap water

841 million people woke up today without basic access to safe water.

We flush our toilets with water that is cleaner than what is available to 11% of the population of this planet.

I remember when I was in high school and first Perrier then Evian bottled water from France bloomed on the American market. Evian is naïve spelled backward, we smugly joked, never realizing we were being brainwashed to reject tap water over fancy water in glass bottle shipped in from foreign countries. This has GOT to change!

For one thing, bottled water is typically 2000 times more expensive than tap water. And you are not risking exposure to harmful BPA. Tap water is much more strictly regulated than bottled water.

Tap water is completely safe. The only reason we know it has trace amounts of lead or arsenic is

because we have become better at testing and can detect smaller and smaller quantities of these chemicals.

Your garden club is poised to partner with the Laguna Beach Water District and the city to install bottle filling stations at the Water District offices and in Jahraus Park because we are committed to reducing the number of single use plastic bottles that end up in landfill.

I hope we all know the benefits of drinking water over sugary or caffeinated beverages. We have been brainwashed into thinking that water in single use plastic bottles is somehow better or safer than tap water. This is not true. Tap water is far more stringently tested than bottled water.



Our tap water has a faint taste of chlorine; completely harmless but not very delicious. A Britta type filter eliminates virtually all of the chemical taste in tap water. Keep a pitcher of filtered water in your fridge to fill your reusable container and you

may be doing more for the planet than you realize.

Botanical water, with fruit and herbs added for flavor, is an even more delicious choice

The winner's photo will be featured on the


front cover of the 2020-21 membership book.
