obin Jones, better known as *Honey* Girl, is a regenerative garden designer, and owner of Honey Girl Grows. She consults, designs, builds, installs, and tends Michelin Star chef gardens, native yard replacements, butterfly gardens, mini orchards, and pollinator projects including National Wildlife-certified habitat gardens.

Robin is a multigenerational farmer, her family owns Whitefish Stage organic farm in Montana, and she is a University of California Master Gardener/Beekeeper. Robin had 14 years of science-based experience mentored under the world's most-published bee researcher and



biologist, Randy Oliver. Robin has also been a national speaker and educator on pollinator conservation, regenerative gardening, and organic

pest management for wineries, at Cal Poly State University and other educational institutions

Robin's clients include homeowners, 5star resorts, the corporate headquarters of Red Bull, Snapchat, and Camp Pendleton. Robin will speak about the native and naturalized Monarch Butterfly, host



plants, and how to attract more pollinators to your garden.

- 3. The entry must be a recent photo of some part of the member's garden.
- 4. To win the **FRONT** cover contest, photo must be **HORIZONTAL** or **SQUARE**.
- 5. To win the **BACK** cover contest, photo must be **VERTICAL or SQUARE**.
- 6. Photos must be of **HIGH-RESOLUTION**. If using iPhone or Android when sending the photo, be sure to send the photo in "**ACTUAL SIZE**" not small, medium, or large. Minimum photo size of **4,000 KB** is required.
- 7. By submitting the entry, the member declares that he/she owns the rights to the photo.
- 8. Renewed membership is required.
- 9. Entries will be judged anonymously by the Board by the end of the club year.
- 10. The winner's photos will be featured on the front and back cover of the 2024-25 Membership Book.


