President's Message

Savor the Seasons in Your Garden

Spring in southern California.

People say there are no seasons in southern California. We know that's not true. There is rainy season, fire season, award season and summer. Spring can be subtle. Or shocking, like the sudden green mantle of winter rye draped over the hills. Fuel, says my neighbor the fireman.



I try to find a few plants for my garden that actually show seasons in this ever green, ever blooming world of southern California. Matilija poppies go from below your knee to above your head in a season. As do sunflowers and sweet peas.



Bulbs push up and bloom like slow motion fireworks. It is fun to tuck seasonal excitement into your garden.

I cultivate a German ivy classified as a straight up weed by many, but which I tolerate because it dies back completely.

In spring it sends tender green tendrils up through the bougainvillea. The large, fleshy leaves foam through the hedge on tough brown stems, In fall, clusters of yellow flowers ripen to seed heads



like giant dandelions. Then the whole vine dies and dries and the plant rests all winter and springs up again each spring. It catches my eye throughout the year and reminds me to pay attention to the subtlety of the seasons.


Julie Bawden-Davis Shares Her Passion for Produce

Our March Meeting Has a Juicy Topic


Learn how to grow delicious heirloom tomatoes. March's presentation by Julie Bawden-Davis includes information on various heirloom tomato favorites and the stories behind them, such as Abe Lincoln, Brandywine, Sweet Pea Currant, Mortgage Lifter and Aunt Ruby's German Green. These tomato varieties and other heirlooms have long, interesting histories. Julie will also share planting, care and harvesting tips, including growing heirloom tomatoes in containers. There will be heirloom tomato plants and Julie's Terrific Tomato Fertilizer for sale after the presentation.



Julie is a bestselling garden writer and University of California Cooperative Extension Master Gardener, who since 1985 has written more than 2,500 articles for publications such as *Organic Gardening*, *Wildflower*, *Better Homes and Gardens* and *The Los Angeles Times*.



She writes a weekly garden column on Parade.com and is author of 12 books, including *Fairy Gardening: Creating Your Own Magical Miniature Garden*, *The Strawberry Story: How to Grow Great Berries Year-Round in Southern California*, *Reader's Digest Flower Gardening* and *Indoor Gardening the Organic Way*. She is also founder and publisher of HealthyHouseplants.com. In 1998, her backyard was certified by the National Wildlife Federation as a Backyard Wildlife Habitat. 
February's Trips & Tours Took Us To Orange (and Santa Ana)




