Rene' was formally educated in the entire spectrum of *Floriculture/Horticulture Institute.*

A frequent speaker at leading art museums, Rene' has also been featured in many national publications like *California Florists, Sunset Magazine, Better Homes & Gardens,* and many more. His work has been featured on *HGTV*.

Rene' will share his insights on the latest floral trends and speak about the floral industry on a broad range of lifestyle flower programs: incorporating the latest flowers, foliage, botanicals, containers and fabrics. His exquisite book collection includes *Rene's Bouquet for Brides*, a stunning five-chapter, large-format photo book, is a must-have for brides.
