December Speaker Tom Carruth Will Share His Rosy Career & Tips On His Favorite Flower

om Carruth is an American award-winning rose hybridizer, who has created more than 100 rose varieties, including eleven All-America Rose Selections. He is currently the E.L. and Ruth B. Shannon Curator of the Rose Collections at the Huntington Library in San Marino, California. Decide early, work hard, get lucky and then enjoy an amazing career is an apt description of Tom Carruth's success as a rose hybridizer and world respected rose authority.

Tom, a native Texan and graduate of Texas A & M (with a masters degree in plant breeding), got his first job with Bill Warriner at Jackson & Perkins (J&P) in Tustin, California, in 1975. At that time, J&P was the most famous rose nursery in the US. He worked with this firm for three and a half years before moving to Armstrong, a well-known nursery that produces all kinds of plants in addition to roses. Here he worked under Herbert Swim and Jack Christensen After seven and a half years, he


left to become a salesman for Weeks; he has spent eleven of his twenty-six years with the firm selling and growing roses and fifteen years hybridizing new ones.

"I fell in love with hybridizing in high school. My parents were bewildered with my interest in genetics." Tom says his father never believed that he could make a career out of breeding flowers.



He has just released a hybrid tea rose named 'Marilyn Monroe'—a creamy apricot with a deep peach center. The blowsy, fully open rose is appropriate for its namesake.

When asked what the future holds for his breeding programs,
Carruth replied "variation in size, form, and fragrance is a must."
He has moved into the production of roses grown on their own roots, which results in stronger and more disease-resistant plants.



He recognizes the success that David Austin has had with his many releases over the past twenty years, wedding old rose form and fragrance with reblooming characteristics.



Carruth is already planning his crosses for next year. He has large greenhouses where the seeds from last year's crosses have been planted, and many tiny plants were already appearing on the surface of the seed flats.

You won't want to miss this exciting speaker at our December 10 meeting.

Open Garden Happy Hour...A Visit to Catherine Hall's Historic San Clemente Home

n November 5, nearly one hundred Laguna Beach Garden Club members enjoyed the first Open Garden Happy Hour event in almost two years. Catherine Hall (past President of LBGC from 2000-02) invited us to visit her beautiful home in San



Clemente that she and her husband have been lovingly renovating and restoring for the past three years.





This special home, known as the Goldschmidt House, was placed on the National Register of Historic Places by the United States Department of the Interior.

The home was built in 1928 on what was then the highest lot in all of San Clemente The home was originally called Casa Tres Vistas because of the views of Saddleback and the range lands to the North, the new city and pier to the South and the ocean, Catalina Island and the bay (now Dana Point) to the West. Many of us began the tour of the home in the Round Room where Catherine told us the history of the home and the famous architect Paul Revere Williams who became the first African American member of the American Institute of Architects in 1923. He designed so many homes for celebrities that he became known as the "Architect

of the Stars". Catherine shared her collection of books about Mr. Williams and his many celebrated projects. She shared many of her interesting stories about the trials, tribulations and joys of restoring an old home which has become their retirement "hobby". An addition was added to the home in the 1960s designed by wellknown Laguna Beach architect Chris Able. The home was in serious need of updating, and their plans and goals for any renovation are

to ensure that the home retains its vintage appeal. Every change to update has been and will continue to be period appropriate. The restoration is very impressive and shows her and her husband's true love for the property. She says the garden is a work in progress, and I am sure, will be equally beautiful in years to come.

Catherine was such a gracious host and treated us like guests in her home. She arranged for a delicious catered taco lunch tacos, quesadillas, & tasty guacamole with chips. Also a variety of drinks including cold beer!! She made individual veggie appetizer servings and 250 delicious homemade cookies also individually wrapped for our safety.


