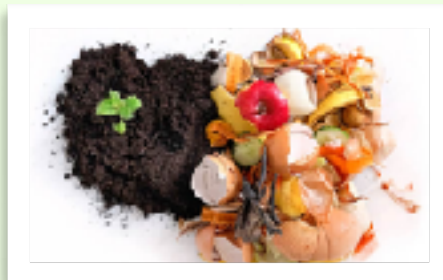

In January Our Thumbs Were White (with flour)

Because Diane Lannon's scones are legendary with club members, on Friday, January 21, six club members met in her kitchen to make scones and later on her patio to share our finished products. Diane had two different recipes available for us to use: her friend Rosie's recipe and one from another baking phenom in the club, Susan Denton. Both recipes are included in this newsletter.

We donned our aprons; Diane demonstrated first then we worked in pairs, each making our own recipe. Diane was well-prepared for us all and had all the ingredients arranged on a side counter. Many of us chose to try our hands (believe me our hands were encrusted in butter & flour by the end) at making Gluten-Free scones. Diane had 2 wide, shallow wooden bowls for us to use, which made

it easier to use our fingers to incorporate the butter and flour mixture into pea-sizes. One of us took advantage of using Diane's stand-mixer, resulting in no batter under her fingernails to clean out.

Each of us shared a segment of our finished product after the baking was finished. Diane made Devonshire Cream for us to add to our scones in addition to the extra butter, jam, and lemon curd set out on the patio table along with coffee and tea. We all left with yummy scones to take home and share with our families. All the best combinations of ingredients were available from which for us to choose.

Kudos to Diane for hosting this successful event.

Community Projects Committee Chair Needed

Laguna Beach Garden Club has set aside funds in an account earmarked for Special Projects so that we can offer grants that enable projects to come to enhance our community. Our mission statement is “*Laguna Beach Garden Club is a service organization, committed to the advancement of gardening, horticulture, ecology, and conservation through education and participation in related community projects.*”

We are currently looking for a committee chair for the Special Projects Committee. The committee meets as needed; previously they met once a month or every other month when one of the members had information to report about a specific project she/he had been researching. Projects have been brought to the attention of the committee through various means: often a club member has an idea of something the Club could remedy; organizations contacted the Club regarding possible funding; a committee member's research brings a project forward. Because of COVID, the committee ceased meeting in March of 2020. Chaired by Jorja Puma, the committee members included: Ora Sterling, Janet Chance, Nancy Englund, and Rosemary McDonald; all are passionate about projects in the city that LBGC can sponsor.

Up to this point, some of the projects include: two water bottle-filling stations, pollinator garden in Heisler Park, funds to offset costs of rehabilitating several trails at Hortense Miller Garden. Other projects on the drawing board are: a second pollinator garden located in Bluebird Park; Boys & Girls Club “New Dream Play Yard” (raised gardens & greenhouse); school garden at Laguna Beach High School; assist in rehabilitating Jahraus Park (across from the Laguna Art Museum), & more bottle-filling stations in the city.

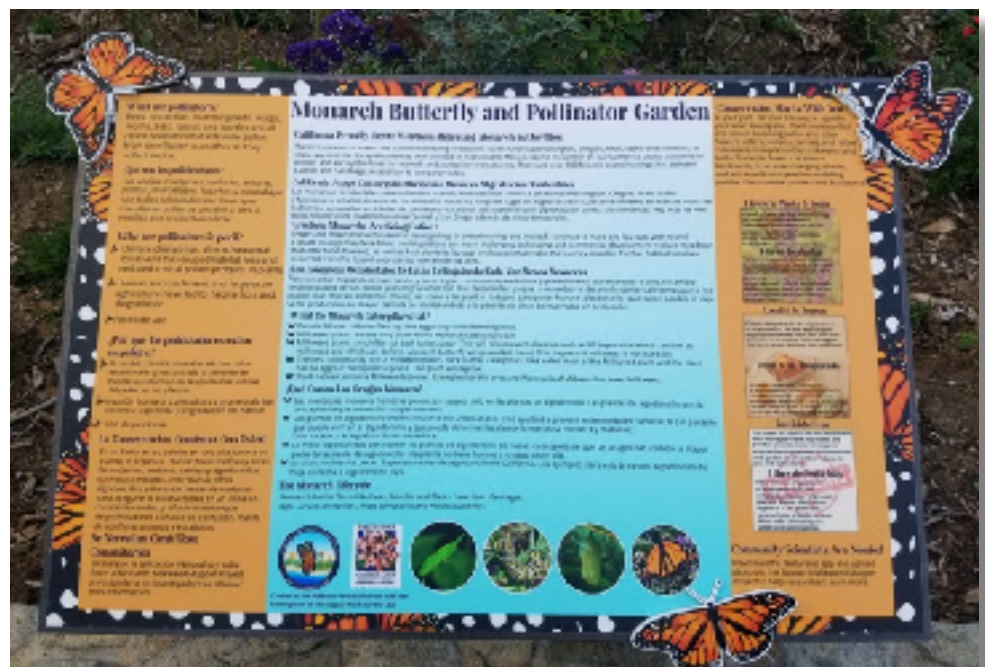
As a member of the Special Projects Committee, the chair will:

- Attend the board meeting to answer possible questions from board members at the presentation meeting

meetings with members of City Council, Water District, or other entities involved in a project
