# Sharing Our Accomplishments & Talents


### Dear Members,

### **April Speaker**


# Valeria Brinker will show us how Ikebana brings out the inner qualities of flowers & other live materials to express emotion

oyful Flowers via Ikebana is the theme of the April 8 guest speaker. Valeria Brinker, professor of the Ikebana Sangetsu School and former President of the Ikebana International Los Angeles will share her expertise of this ancient art of flower arranging.

Brinker received her Jyo-Kyoju title in 1993 from the headquarters of the Sogetsu School in Japan. Last year she was one of the speakers of the North Dakota University Master Gardeners 2020 Virtual Conference. She teaches in Torrance and San Diego.

Ikebana is the art of Japanese flower arrangement that embraces utilizing flowers, branches and leaves to evoke a minimalist sense of balance and form. This art form originated sometime in the 6th century with the introduction of Buddhism to Japan by Chinese missionaries. The style prioritizes five main

points in addition to following the natural growth of branches and flowers used: arrange flowers naturally, arrange flowers quickly, as if you were painting a picture, arrange flowers in harmony, arrange flowers with joy.
