November Meeting

Permaculture—Your Garden as a Place for Living

Jessica Viola, founder and owner of Viola Garden Designs, Viola Garden Builds, and Viola Living Jewels, will be the featured speaker at the Laguna Beach Garden Club's

November 10th meeting.

Her topic,

“Permaculture—Your Garden as a Place for Living”, will address landscape design based on regenerative, whole-system solutions and artistic vision. Her approach to gardens is integrative and holistic, fostering a deeper relationship between mother nature and human nature.

Jessica began her practice in landscape construction, habitat restoration, environmental design and organic gardening in 1999. She received her certification in Earth Architecture from the Cal-Earth Institute, and her teacher-training certificate in Permaculture and Ecological Design from Earthflow and the Permaculture Institute in New Mexico. Jessica teaches permaculture and hosts workshops throughout Southern California. She says that her heart has always been

with the Earth, and when she found the field of Permaculture it changed her life. The system spoke to her, integrating a holistic approach to landscape design, as well as gardening.



Her goal is to find a sustainable and ecologically sound way of employing time-tested approaches to garden design, landscape architecture and construction within a modern context. Throughout the years Jessica has cultivated a diverse portfolio of regenerative hardscape solutions and creative drought tolerant and native plant palettes that she will share during her presentation.

Jessica's work has been featured in *Sunset*, *Jenna Cooper LA*, *Luxe Source*, *Voyage LA*, *Bright Young Things*. She was a 2023 Pacific Design Center Star of Design Nominee for Landscape Architecture.

Hortense Miller Garden Updates



The current photography exhibit in the Aviary Gallery: *We All Get Along*

The current exhibit was inspired by Hortense Miller's love for wildlife. She wrote often of its behavior, and how it makes a garden more interesting. Hortense respected wildlife because it knew how to share, how to get along. Observation informed her thoughts and writings for decades. She truly loved the garden home she created for wildlife to live freely, and to stay wild. "The shine on the raven's wing is what we have compared all other shining things to for thousands of years. It is incomparable."

The photographs in the exhibit feature images of local wildlife by contributing photographers Rebecca May, Dennis Hahn, Peggy Honda and Ron Leighton.

April 1984, an excerpt from the Garden Essays of Hortense Mann Miller

"For 20 years, the local wild animals were fed here – and nightly. There were mostly raccoons, 17 have shown up at the same time. There were also as many as seven foxes, seven skunks, and a couple of opossums. The opossums never became at all trusting, but the others did and would let us walk among them, or they would come to us. They got along together and their manners were good, and they were, of course, a constant delight. Because of the endless building around Laguna, coyotes never before came here. Now there are many of them, and although it is fine to hear them sing, the smaller animals have no chance with coyotes, so I judged it unwise to concentrate them here. After the fire the animals could not eat ashes, were scarce, and I did not resume feeding them. The feeding of birds has continued and now includes a pair of ravens who enjoy carrion with donuts on top. Rabbits, ground squirrels, gophers, wild rats, mice and shrews, a variety of snakes, and a couple of types of lizards all make their home here. We all get along." These items were curated by the HMG Art Committee volunteers: Kristy Melita, Michele Leighton and Cheryl Michelon.

A native of St. Louis, Hortense moved to Laguna Beach in 1953 and died in 2008 just shy of her 100th birthday. A lifelong writer, ferocious gardener and talented craftsperson, she was straightforward, unpretentious and feisty in her philosophy about gardening, politics, love and life in general. Although the property has been owned by Laguna Beach since 1977 when Hortense bequeathed it to the City, it is managed and cared for by a volunteer Board that must annually raise funds to repair and maintain the house as well as the more than 800 species of plants and trees that fill the dozens of slope side paths.

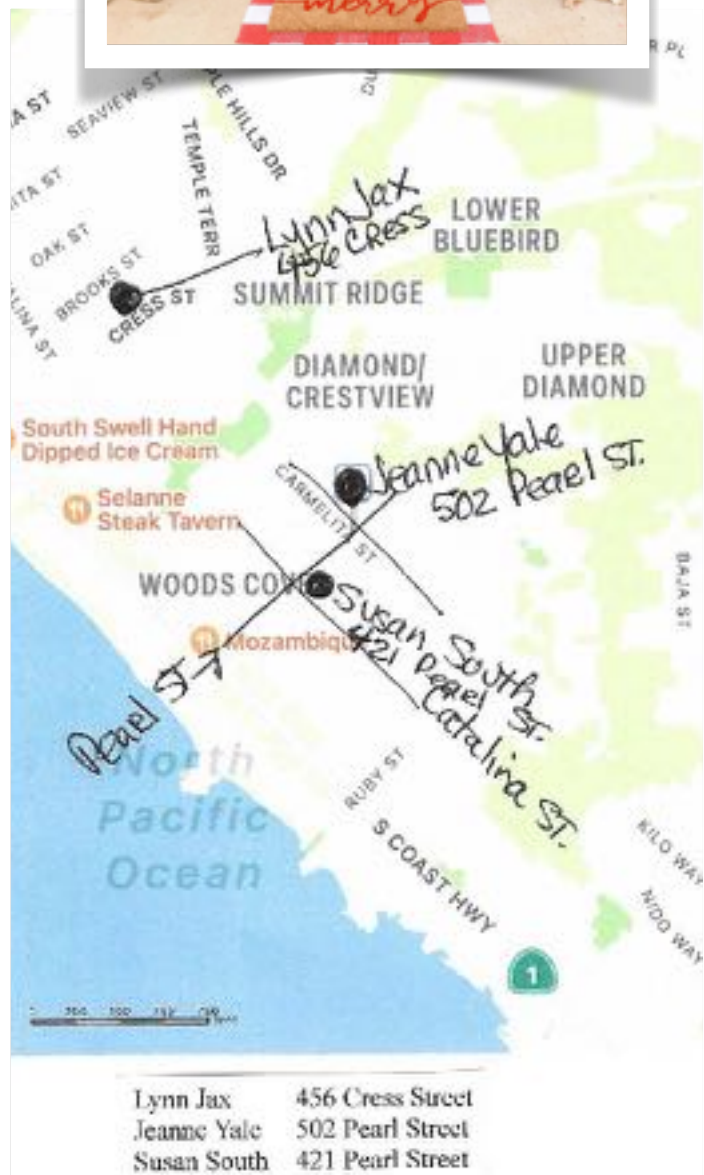
