



## Matt Willey - Special Guest at Laguna Art Museum

As part of our Club's on-going collaboration with Laguna Art Museum we sponsored Matt Willey's The Good of the Hive® presentation held Saturday, February 24 as their final speaker in their Art + Nature programming. It was an intimate setting with about 40 people in attendance. Matt disused the experience of creating the murals including ours, and how the murals fit into the global puzzle – offering powerful moments of connection in our Laguna community and around the world.

One thing he shared which really resonated with the crowd is finding out that 90% of the seeds in the world's food systems are owned and controlled by corporations. For Matt as an artist and storyteller, this feels terribly bad. He said "there are only two symbols in the history of storytelling that are consistently used as symbols of hope and possibility. Babies and seeds. What does it mean when a few giant companies control hope?" This changed everything for Matt in terms of how he sees the bees and his work with them.

Our mural is now part of The Good of the Hive® world where people see the beauty and connectedness of all things and act accordingly – with curiosity, kindness, and love - for the good of OUR our hive. Spread the BUZZ!

## **Scholarship Winners Today**

Dana Spencer and Stephanie Alvarado, students of the Horticulture and Landscaping Department at Saddleback Community College (SBCC), were recipients of the Laguna Beach Garden Club 2023 scholarships. I spoke with these delightful students at our meeting last spring then communicated with Ken Lee, Chairman of their department, to discuss using our Laguna Niguel HOA, which has many acres, for potential future classroom projects. It was Dana and Stephanie who enthusiastically volunteered and accepted the challenge to plan and design the highly visible clubhouse area near the front entry. Their comprehensive plans

included recommendations and resources regarding drought resistant plants, seasonal color, fire hardening, maintenance, and irrigation. We live in a high hazard fire area and the students addressed the community's concern regarding future fires. Dana and Stephanie are a creative team who worked many hours completing this project. Their professional commitment has been outstanding.

Currently, Dana and Stephanie are enrolled in The Native Landscape Design Class taught by Jodie Cook (who is LBGC's featured speaker for May 2024) and Mike Evans. Jodie is the instructor who advised them on the Laguna Niguel HOA project and is well-known locally for her work with Moulton Niguel Water District developing their Naturescape program. Mike is the owner of Tree of Life Nursery and Native plant expert.



The project at our HOA was mutually so successful that SBCC inquired if we would consider having future students do design work in other communal areas and if current students could do group conceptual designs as finals for the class with incorporation of seating area, rocks,



paths, etc.

The nearby Saddleback Community College Horticulture and Landscaping Department has amazing resources and talent and is willing to assist local communities through their classroom projects.

Thank you LBGC for supporting this program and awarding scholarships to deserving students!

Submissions should be sent to Perry Stampfel via email. You will receive a reply confirming that your photo has been received.



We heard from a researcher about some of the institute's conservation initiatives, including a successful reforestation project. The MVI 38-acre campus forms part of the famous Monteverde Reserve Complex, an area of natural

preserves that protect more than 65,000 acres of endangered tropical forest. This location underlines the importance of MVI's commitment to sustainability. In the adjacent photos, we are making soil pods for tree seedlings to get their start.

On another day we rafted through the Cano Negro Wildlife Refuge, where we planted 4 young trees as part of

the reforestation project. The Costa Ricans are passionate about rebuilding their forests. -Dalynn Malek

lmost 20 club members enjoyed perfect weather for a leisurely tour of the **San Diego Botanic Garden** on Friday, 2/23. President and CEO of the garden, the dynamic **Ari Novy** gave us an overview and pointed out some of the engineering challenges of suspending gorgeous chandeliers of epiphytes to make more room for events in the new greenhouse.

With nearly four miles of trails spanning 37 acres, we wandered among plants and environments from desert to tropical forest and everywhere in between. There are twenty-nine different gardens with more than 5,000 species of trees, palms, and bamboo from around the world. The bamboo collection is impressive. We felt like kids exploring the different interactive children's gardens. The gardens have expanded and there is a new entrance by the greenhouse. My favorite garden, Jeff Moore's underwater succulent installation, is still there, albeit across a parking lot.

After the garden we all enjoyed lunch at Fish Shop in Encinitas.

## Bees, Rain and Murals

B ased on several studies and a lot of anecdotal evidence, we know that honeybees are good at predicting the weather. In fact, honeybees seem to be more accurate than The Weather Channel when it comes to predicting rain. Not only can they predict it, but they can estimate its intensity. When they sense a heavy rain, their defensiveness increases as they predict that food will be in short supply due to not being able to leave the hive.

Like the bees and their behavior in the rain, the *Laguna Beach Garden Club* sensed the clarion call for education about how dire the problem of diminishing pollinators has become and that the world's food supply is radically decreasing. According to a 2017 report, more than 700 different North American species of bees are headed toward extinction. This creates a huge concern for US food security. Bees are a key link in the natural food chain, without bees, many herbivores would simply starve. And without those plant eaters, the meat eaters would also falter. Honeybees contribute an estimated 15 billion to crop production. Honeybees are like flying dollar bills flying over US crops!

Our bee friends, particularly wild bees are also responsible for climate change mitigation. They are credited with fostering rich natural vegetation, which is known to offset carbon emissions. This is why your Board of Directors felt so strongly about raising greater awareness to the plight that will affect every single one of us if we cannot turn the tide on this serious problem.

Public murals have long served as powerful platforms for social activism. Public art is uniquely accessible and enables people to experience art during daily life, outside of museums. By presenting these messages in public spaces, artists spark conversation, challenge perceptions, and inspire collective action for positive change. The engagement builds a sense of ownership and pride within a community, fostering a shared commitment to the message. Public art activates the imagination and encourages people to pay attention and perceive more deeply the environment they occupy. A lecture or email does not have near the same impact!

Combined with our participation in bringing more pollinator gardens to our city, assisting the local schools to integrate this education using the school gardens we have funded, and now with our beautiful mural, we

hope to spread the message in a hope-driven, positive way to change the behaviors in all who engage with this beautiful work of art.

So if you have wondered why a mural? Why this mural? Why this artist? Why now? I hope you understand the depth of the thought process that went into deciding how we, as a club could have the biggest impact on our city to bring about the changes needed to reverse this dire trend. From influencing public policy such as the latest bill to save the bees signed by Governor Newsom to restrict bee-killing neonicotinoids (class of pesticides) to encouraging the





allowance of more green space to provide more habitat as the Xerces society focuses on, (yet another organization that the club supports), to having the public understand and appreciate what pollinators bring to their lives. "Bee" positive and "Bee" supportive and help save the bees! Buzz Buzz
